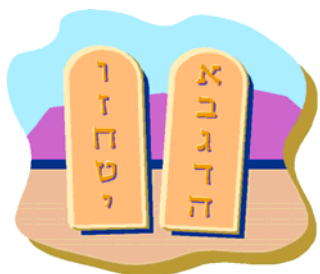

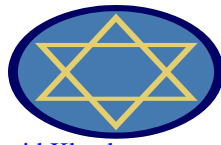

There is a Jewish saying: *kol hathalot kashot*, all beginnings are difficult. So are all endings.

I have many outstanding memories of my thirteen years at TNT: sharing special moments in your lives, both happy and sad; welcoming guests to the synagogue, including many Christian visitors and a number of scholars and artists; feeling uplifted by your participation in our Shabbat and holiday services; enjoying the stimulation of your questions at our family and adult education programs.

A Shavuot Renaissance

I have always wondered why Shavuot seems to get short shrift in Jewish experience, compared with the other two *r'galim*, Sukkot and Pesach. Of course, Shavuot in America lasts a scant two days, while Sukkot and Pesach invite us to celebrate for eight. In addition, Shavuot has no discernible, tangible image to compare with the seder, specific foods and rich symbolism of Pesach, and the creative huts, lulav shak-

ing/beating and etrog holding/smelling during Sukkot. In fact, Sukkot has earned the name "*HeChag*" (THE holiday), and Pesach cannot be forgotten as "*Z'man Cheiruteinu*" (the time we celebrate our freedom).

Finally, while Sukkot and Pesach fall squarely within the religious school year, Shavuot usually occurs beyond the religious school schedule. I recently asked a group of 5th graders (not at TNT) to tell me about Shavuot, and they had a very difficult time putting the holiday concept into words.

With this article as my manifesto, I aim to rescue Shavuot from the clutches of semi-obscurity, and create a Shavuot renaissance at Temple Ner Tamid. Where should I start? First of all, I present Shavuot's moniker, "*Zman Matan Torateinu*" (time that G-d gave us our Torah). The word *matan* comes from the root *nun, taf, nun--* to give. But I might offer this nominal phrase as *Z'man Matanah Torateinu* (time of the GIFT of Torah). While on Simchat Torah we celebrate renewing the cycle of Torah reading, only on Shavuot do we commemorate G-d giving Moses the Torah (literally, the teaching) on Mount Sinai. Powerful stuff!

Second, while Shavuot does not provide the food specificity of Pesach, we do celebrate the holiday with traditional dairy foods. If you have never enjoyed a delectable blueberry blintz, my heart--and palate--reach out to you. (Remind me to bring my Dairy Ease pills!)

If you seek a joyous musical experience, look no further than Shavuot. We stand and sing the exulting *Hallel* service, hear the traditional *akdamut* melody in the *Kiddush*, and hear the ancient trope illuminating the story of Ruth, the first convert to Judaism (and great-grandmother of King David!). For those wishing to remember their loved ones, we also offer an evening Yizkor service.

Of course, many identify Shavuot with graduation and/or confirmation. I personally look forward to honoring our community's high school graduates, and learning of the generous scholarship awardees. Mazal tov to our budding collegians!

Finally, in the spirit of Torah, I would like to issue an invitation. I would like to devote Wednesday evenings in the late spring/early summer to teaching an adult class in Torah OR Haftarah trope. In this class, we will not only learn melodies for the trope, but gain a better understanding of the derivation of trope, why we read trope and how trope is used and organized. I will provide CD and/or .WAV recordings, and a syllabus. What I will need from all interested students is to "vote" for either Torah or Haftarah. Please email me at bramersja@yahoo.com to submit your votes, and I look forward to tabulating the results.

Together, we can bring "*Z'man Matan Torateinu*" to the forefront of ritual life at Temple Ner Tamid.

My knowledge of Hebrew is sparse. It was unusual (although not unheard of) for girls of my generation to attend Hebrew school. I did, however, thanks to my father, attend Sunday School where I learned about Jewish history and Jewish holidays. Hebrew was taught, but it was not the focus of learning. I wish I had taken it upon myself, at that time, to practice and become better at reading Hebrew. However, I am grateful that, today, I can follow the service and participate. I still get tripped up on some of the letters that resemble each other, but I hope to take a course that will sharpen my reading skills.

During the years I attended Sunday School, vocabulary was another area of sparse learning. I did pick up a few words like *boker tov*, *erev tov*, *todah* and *sheket yeladim*, to name a few. I thought *shalom* meant hello, goodbye and peace. Recently, I discovered that there is no word for *goodbye* in Hebrew. The word that comes closest to the English *goodbye* is the Hebrew word *l'hitraot*. This is based on the Hebrew word that means "to see". So, *l'hitraot* literally means "till we see each other again".

This is my final article in the TNT bulletin as Sisterhood president and I would like to take this opportunity to tell you how grateful I am to have been in this position for the past two years (recycled from over 30 years ago). It has been a privilege and pleasure to have taken this journey with such a wonderful group of volunteers. Our board members take on challenges of serving not only our Temple community, but also the community at large.

We are fortunate to be a multi generational group. I am convinced that we compliment one another. Our next president, Elisa Zimmerman, is the first of the 2nd generation to share the title of president. The TNT Religious School year concluded on a festive note on Sunday morning, May 15 as the entire school community, grades K-10/Confirmation, gathered in the social hall to begin a dual celebration. The tempting aroma of falafel floated through the synagogue as Kitah Vav (6th grade) teacher, Talya Paul, prepared delicious Israeli food and set up a festive room decked out in blue and white with the help of parent volunteers Linda Gross, Alyssa Landau, Judy Kemp and Alyse Barbash; the students of Kitah Vav; and Temple Administrator Beth Hoffman. In a celebration of Yom Ha'Atzma'ut, Israel Independence Day, students, parents and teachers enjoyed a sampling of hummus, falafel, Israeli salad, pita and oranges before joining in singing Israeli songs led by your education director, Morah Laura Berkson, and Mrs. Paul. Mrs. Paul's helped to round out the celebration with her joyful energy and talent by leading everyone in a series of Israeli dances.

The school community then moved to the sanctuary for a special year-end service and ceremony. Students of Kitah Bet (2nd grade) led everyone in a special service, and the students were honored for their achievements in learning to read Hebrew. Each student received a personalized copy of Siddur Sim Shalom and the Kitah Bet ceremony concluded with a special Shehecheyanu blessing as the children's parents and some grandparents stood proudly around them, holding a large tallit over the heads of their children as the blessing was sung.

Each student in grades K-6 received a Certificate of Completion and a JNF Tzedakah box as their accomplishments in their religious school studies were noted and they were promoted to the next level of study for the coming year. May the summer be filled with adventure and rest, that we may bring to our school renewed energy in the year to come.

About the PMC:

The Pan-Mass Challenge is an annual bike-a-thon and a pioneer of the athletic fundraising industry that today raises more money for charity than any other single event in the country. The organization was founded in 1980 and has since raised \$303 million for cancer research and treatment at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute through its Jimmy Fund.

The PMC donates 100 percent of every rider-raised dollar directly to the cause.

The Ride:

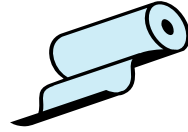
The Pan-Massachusetts Challenge is a fully supported bike-a-thon — with food and water stops, mechanical and medical assistance, luggage transportation, and lodging — that runs through 46 towns across Massachusetts. Approximately 5,000 cyclists ride in the event. Cyclists choose from 11 routes of varying mileage designed to cater to all levels of cycling strength and time availability. There are six two-day routes that range from 153 to 190 miles and five one-day rides that range from 25 to 110 miles. In 2011, cyclists are required to raise between \$500 and \$4,200 to ride in the PMC, depending on the chosen route.

When:

The 32nd annual PMC will be held on August 6 and 7, 2011. The ride has two starting lines on Saturday, Aug. 6, in Sturbridge and in Wellesley, and five finish lines in Provincetown (2), Bourne, Wellesley or Sharon on either Saturday, Aug. 6 or Sunday, Aug. 7.

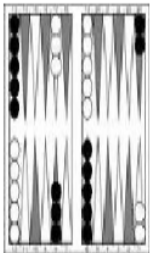
